## Beware of Fraudulent Phishing Emails

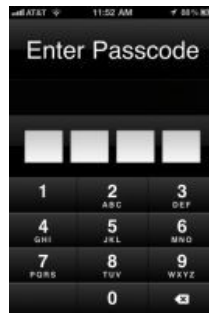


People have been receiving fraudulent phishing emails that appear as if they are from NACHA (National Automated Clearing House). NACHA manages the ACH Network which serves as a safe, secure, reliable network for direct consumer, business, and government payments, and annually facilitates billions of payments such as Direct Deposit and Direct Payment.

These fraudulent emails are phishing emails and the perpetrators intend to gain access to emails, passwords, and other personal information. The emails may also contain web links or attachments that may install malicious code onto your system. It is important to always keep antivirus software up to date.

## Think Twice When Creating an iPhone Passcode



Daniel Amitay, the creator of the now defunct "Big Brother Camera Security" application for the iPhone made an interesting discovery when it comes to what numbers people use when choosing iPhone passcodes.

The application required that the iPhone user create a passcode to start the app. After 200,000 people installed his application, he realized that many of them used the same passcodes and he could only assume that the passcodes they used for his iPhone application were the

same passcodes that they use to lock their iPhone. The passcodes he saw the most were

5683 5555  
0852 1111  
2222 2580  
1212 0000  
1998 1234

Sadly, these are all very predictable passcodes. Amitay's advice to us is to use a passcode that is not such a simple pattern. Also, go into your "Settings," hit the "General," button, tap "Passcode Lock," and toggle off the "Simple Passcode". This will allow you to input a passcode longer than four characters.
